

## **Dr. Faye R. Davis**

**Professor of Logistics  
Industrial College of the Armed Forces  
National Defense University**



Dr. Faye Davis is the Defense Logistics Agency Chairperson at the National Defense University and a professor of logistics on the faculty of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces. She develops core curriculum and advanced studies course materials, lectures, and conducts graduate seminar instruction in strategic logistics and related subject areas. Dr. Davis also conducts and directs research on logistics practices and principles, the formulation of national strategy and national security policy, and the resource component that shapes national strategy outcomes. She is a primary faculty advisor, a research study advisor, and contributes to the development, coordination, and teaching of sub-Saharan Africa regional security study. In her current position, Dr. Davis represents the agency to components within the National Defense University, to components within the Department of Defense, federal agencies, and foreign governments. She coordinates the DLA and ICAF interface on programs for logistics, supply management, and related activities.

Prior to ICAF, Dr. Davis' professional experience included 12 years of progressive leadership assignments in Air Force acquisition positions, which were primarily in contracting, but also included assignments in program management and information systems. Her tenure with DLA began in 1992 as Deputy Director of Contracting at the Defense Supply Center Columbus, Columbus, Ohio. Her DSCC leadership positions included chief information officer, senior contracting executive, director of procurement, maritime weapons systems group director, and 1993 base realignment and closure project director.

Dr. Davis is a member of the Defense Acquisition Corps and is a level III certified contracting professional. She has a bachelor of science degree in business and psychology from Northern Kentucky University, master of science degree in planning/health care administration from the University of Cincinnati, master of science degree in National Resource Strategy from ICAF, masters certificate in project management from George Washington University, and doctorate in business and policy studies from the University of Cincinnati. She also holds a certificate of graduation from the ICAF senior acquisition course and is a graduate of the Air Force Education with Industry program.

Dr. Davis is a recipient of the Air Force Association Award in Information Systems Excellence and the Defense Logistics Agency Superior Civilian Service Award.
